Rina Rompis left the shelter on 6 July 2019 at the age of 16.

Rina was admitted to the shelter as a victim of the tsunami disaster on 28 September 2018. After having been on Dolidi for 9 months, her family situation after the disaster in terms of composition and accommodation was restored to such an extent that Rina could go back to her family. The time that Rina had been in the shelter was not easy for the Dolidi family due to traumatic experiences she had previously suffered. Rina is doing a secondary education for nurse. Her total livelihood is now again borne by her family. We wish Rina lots of success and happiness in her future life.

New in the shelter

Jurni Lawio was admitted to our childcare center on 10 July 2019 as a disadvantaged child.

Jurni was born on November 5, 2004 in the town of Gintu in the Bada valley. Her living conditions and therefore her chances in life were such that we decided to take her in permanently. Jurni is very enthusiastic and happy within the Dolidi family and has adapted quickly. Jurni is now going to the SMP (junior high) school in Tentena and is in class 2.

Delvon Toea was admitted to our childcare center on 4 July 2019 as a disadvantaged child.

Delvon was born in the town of Salindu and is the younger brother of Meiske Toea, who has been living with the Dolidi family since 1 July 2018. Delvon first attended the primary SD school in Salindu where he received free education as an underprivileged child. Delvon is now going to the SMP (junior high) school in Tentena and is in class 1.

Recording and selection policy;

Due to privacy, the board of the Dolidi Ndano Foundation has decided not to disclose sensitive information about children who are leaving or who are being admitted to our shelter. You can assume that we do thorough research and consult before we make a decision. The wishes and interests of the child are always central. If a disadvantaged child lives with family or a host family, a disadvantaged child can also count on our support by sponsoring the school education up to and including the senior high school. We do this directly at the school and we monitor progress and performance.



Shelter Dolidi Ndano



After 10 years of building and renovating, all our plans have been realized to allow disadvantaged children to grow up optimally in a good and safe environment. The quality and living conditions of the entire project are above average. In doing so, we have taken into account the rights and duties of our children. All facilities on land and buildings are now ready and will only need maintenance in the coming years.

The rights of the child that we can now also give substance to at the shelter are;

- ✚ Right to education through our practice training building and the education volunteer policy
- ✚ Right to healthy food and drink due to our good hygienic kitchen facilities and our own vegetable garden
- ✚ Right to health care and assistance through our medical goal and own clinic
- ✚ Right to free time to do what you feel like, we have an auditorium where children can read, make music, dance or relax.
- ✚ Right to play sports, in a team on our volleyball court or table tennis table, and individually such as swimming
- ✚ Right to play through our playground or game corner
- ✚ Right to protection through our safe buildings, surveillance and non-physical punishment policy
- ✚ In addition, we respect all other rights of the child if they are not included in our rules

The duties of our children in the shelter are;

- Must follow the house rules
- Must focus on their own future
- Must participate in the corvee and garden maintenance schedule
- Must keep their own rooms and bathroom clean
- Must live together in harmony within the Dolidi family.

Study fund 1




In the previous newsletter we reported that 4 children are leaving the shelter to study. That eventually became 3. Tabitha has passed her entrance exam at the STIK Stella Maris academy in Makassar for her medical study nursing. Utin has passed her entrance exam at STIEM Bongaya University in Makassar for her accountancy studies. Gideon has passed his entrance exam at the Barombong Shipping Academy in Makassar for his studies in marine technology. Unfortunately, Alfret has been rejected for the Barombong Academy where he wants to study as a skipper. Alfret has passed all tests but was rejected on the basis of his age (15 years) because there were more applicants than the training could place. Alfret may try again next year and the chances are greater because he now knows what awaits him and is a year older. Together we agreed to sign him up every year until he is hired, he can do it and this is what he wants in his heart. Due to the annual intake and outflow of students in the house, we expect an average of 5 students to stay in the house. Titin and Opin will finish their studies in 2020 and Ferdinan and Alfret will start.

So, we now have a total of 5 children studying in Makassar. We have now preferred this city because there are many universities and you can do almost all studies there. For us this means that we can organize everything more easily. One of the problems is that we always have to look for accommodation for our children, which costs a lot of money. So, we started looking for a good and cheaper solution, and we found it. Slightly outside the city, but given the distance to the university at a very convenient location, we were able to rent a new-build home in a security-guarded park with an option to purchase. In this completely new house are 2 bedrooms, a living room / bedroom, a toilet / bathroom, an outdoor kitchen and a garden. So, it is easy for 6 children to sleep. The rental costs for this house are 20 million Idr. per year (approximately € 1200) The park has a sports field and a swimming pool for residents only. The total park costs are € 50 per month So for € 150 per month we have found accommodation where 6 children can stay. The photos speak for themselves!



For transport to the university or other activities, the students have 2 scooters from a private sponsor available. Despite the different lectures, the transport is well organized. All students now have proof that they can drive in Makassar.





Study fund 2



My name is Mutiara (Tiara) Widiyanti Tosinde. I have lived on Dolidi for a long time since 2012. And now I study at a private university in Central Java, the Satya Wacana Christian University, Salatiga. I am now in the second year of semester 1 of the law faculty. I have been living as a student of the law faculty in Salatiga for a year and have gained a lot of knowledge, both in academic and non-academic areas. In terms of free time, I use it to search for references, because we never forget the teacher's assignments every day. My goal was to study at the Faculty of Law, because I wanted to do a good, neutral law study, working according to laws and regulations. My focus / concentration that I will choose later is most likely "criminal law", because we learn many things there and the process of resolution based on the laws and regulations adopted. I would like to thank Opa Eef, the sponsors, and the Dolidi Ndano foundation board that, from the beginning to now, has supported and fulfilled my needs. For the time being, I have not been able to repay all your friendliness. So, a short word from me, and then I say a lot of thanks. God bless you. With love: Tiara.

Agnes; I live on the Sanquan Medical Collage of Xinxiang Medical University. My experience at the university is that I have received many new things, for example when I learned to use English and Mandarin in class, how I interact with people who speak foreign languages. In the first year of the university I have 5 days of lectures for language and medical studies, 2 days off and sports on Saturdays and Sundays. The tight schedule is in line with our talents in sports such as badminton, volleyball. We also had karate lessons (shaolin and taichi) in the first year of study, and I was also very happy with my performance in the first year by achieving very good results for semesters 1 and 2. I now experience them eating noodles with chopsticks, and we also learned how we can only eat breakfast bread every morning, but this is not all that interests us in living abroad (China). We have also experienced various Chinese festivals and we participate in art such as donating Indonesian songs. A very memorable experience was when we first played with snow. How cold it is to -4, and although it is cold, I still invite friends to play in the snow, this is of course an unforgettable experience in making snowmen. The purpose of my study is to achieve my goals as a doctor and to experience how I can study abroad. And feel how cold the snow that can normally only be seen on TV now can be held. At the end of the word, I do not forget to thank Opa Eef the board and the sponsor (s) who helped me with the study financing. I will try to do my best to make everyone proud. Lots of love,

On behalf of Gideon, I (Opa Eef) write a piece for the newsletter.




The family only has the possibility to have contact on Sunday during / after the church service. I have done that twice now and Gideon is doing well, it is not easy and he has lost a lot of weight. But he is healthy and has now received enormous discipline and condition. He will be senior on November 7 and we will have a party at Barombong to celebrate that. Then he also gets his freedom back and can simply go and relax in our new student house during his days / hours off. He also gets his cell phone back and we have regular contact. 
Study fund 3

Gideon (continued);

The church service in the small church on Barombong is attended by some 40 Christian cadets on Sunday morning, with the family also being welcome. Gideon receives visitors every Sunday from Opin, Titin, Utin and Tabitha. After the service, the family always distributes some extra food that they have brought for the Cadets. They are a welcome addition to the food of the academy and they taste good. The two times that I visited Gideon, I brought 100 filled sweet rolls that ran out very quickly. The reason for quarantine is that every cadet must be tested to see if they can withstand the rigorous training. In addition to their professional knowledge, the execution of their profession at sea requires a great deal of discipline, stress resistance and fitness. Barombong Academy has a partnership with the Holland America line for filling vacancies. Who knows, Gideon will be spotted in Rotterdam in a few years.



We continue to guide and help students in everything. We then use the WhatsApp or Email for communication. This way we stay well-informed about the daily routine. Here is just an example about the way in which we communicate. Incidentally, Tabitha is doing well! She is happy with her choice and is having a great time at Stella Maris where she is doing her studies. Utin is also having a great time at STIEM Bongaya University, where she is studying accountancy.





It has already been a year since the construction of our clinic was completed. Since that time, we have been working on obtaining all permits for the introduction of our medical care and aid program for underprivileged children. The permit for this is the Dinas Kesehatan healthcare service. They logically handle this very carefully and we have had to adjust the application and / or add missing documents several times. The time has finally come for our application to be complete and our clinic to be registered as Social. (See document on the right). We are not there yet, because there must still be a complete permit designed in such a way that foreign doctors can also do their volunteer work here with full permission. This has been arranged for the local doctor Dr. Mardi. The entire implementation of health care in our clinic falls under the auspices of Dr. Mardi. The clinic will soon receive a visit from people who provide accreditation, who will therefore check whether everything meets the organizational and practical requirements. They then look at the bookkeeping, the instruments, the resources, the hygiene, the accessibility and the layout of the building. The quality of the workplace, patient treatment and admission is also assessed. After the accreditation, a license is issued and issued, after which we can start. The expectation is that we amply meet all requirements! And that the permit will be granted. Unfortunately, we do not yet dare to say when that will be exactly.


Marjon, the board of the Edese GC Papendal, participants and donors.... Thank you very much!

Jurni, one of our new children, came from the town of Gintu in the Bada valley. For us a good time to organize the trip and to pick her up with most of her new brothers and sisters. After almost a year of cutting and sewing, the new traditional "Pamona" clothing is ready for our children. The clothing is tailor-made and delivered at low costs thanks to the help of local seamstresses. The children use the clothing for their performances in singing and dancing during events and / or special occasions.

Opa Eef has moved from the resort to the shelter to be closer to the children. That was a long-held wish of Grandfather and the children. It also makes it all so much easier to manage. The new house was designed by Eef himself and paid for from his own pocket.



In addition to his studies, Dodi is doing volunteer work at an organization that helps disadvantaged children in Java. This also fits within his Politics study in which he may opt for social work ... who knows!

In our previous newsletter we already announced that we will support Yayasan (foundation) Yahya in Tentena if our finances allow it. After all, we have the same goal. In the photo, Eef hands over the 17 new mattresses for their 17 children, who offer them shelter.

The girls at Dolidi have received a new bathroom in their sleeping building. The girls are very happy with it and have also received much more privacy.
