Impact Coronavirus COVID-19 for the project on Sulawesi

Dear sponsors, financial adopters, donors, volunteers and interested parties.

In this extra edition we tell you about the situation we are in as a result of the corona virus.

We are also dealing with this Covid-19 virus in Central Sulawesi and we have been taking our precautionary measures for some time now. Fortunately, we were able to bring our students to the shelter and our large family is fully and healthy at Dolidi.

We have taken our precautions to minimize the risk of infection. The shelter is closed to the outside world and only necessary visits are allowed under the supervision of our security and strict observance of our safety and hygiene measures.

However, the impact for the Dolidi Ndano foundation is great. We need to review our budget for this year and postpone and / or adjust planned plans. Financially we do not have any concerns yet, but we do take into account a sharp drop in income. Donation from promotions will be canceled and there is no contribution from the resort because all bookings for this summer have already been canceled. As a result, we also miss many spontaneous donations from guests who have seen the shelter and therefore want to support the project.

The 2019-2020 coronavirus pandemic was confirmed to spread to Indonesia on March 2, 2020, when a dance instructor and her mother were infected with a Japanese subject. On April 9, the pandemic had spread to all provinces in Indonesia, after Gorontalo (Sulawesi) confirmed his first case. On April 13, President Jokowi declared the Covid-19 virus a national disaster

Situation COVID-19 in Central Sulawesi

Until April 13, 283 confirmed infections, 2 people were cured and 3 people died in Sulawesi Tengah province. The number of infections and victims is still increasing and is getting closer for Doldi. Meanwhile, 9 people have been tested positive in the nearest town of Poso (60 km away). The flight connections to and from Central Sulawesi have been closed for unnecessary destinations. The access roads are also blocked, allowing only necessary destination traffic to pass through. Means of transport and people are then disinfected at these stations. In Tentena, only the banks, the market, the supermarkets and aid organizations are open and there is strict enforcement control. Schools and churches are closed, group gatherings such as wedding and funeral are prohibited.

The shelter is closed to visitors from March 17. This is indicated on the 2 entrances of our site by information and warning signs. Necessary visitors may only enter the site under the supervision of our security if they meet all precautionary and preventive measures. Washing and disinfection have been placed near the plates, body temperature is measured and their contacts have been asked for the past few days.




On March 16, the government closed all schools and universities and switched to online classes. That was the reason and opportunity for us to create a safe environment for our children and staff. We are also fortunate to be able to do that because of the very suitable location 5 km outside Tentena. We also have a clinic in which we can place people of our Doldi family in isolation from illness if necessary. Our children are not allowed to leave the site and must observe the preventive measures. For our staff, after a necessary visit in Tentena for e.g. groceries, when disinfection procedure is first done on money bills and goods and then the prevention measures are maintained. Purchased food is well cooked and / or baked. In the meantime, our family has expanded with our students who are all at Doldi now. They first spent 2 days in isolation and have now moved to the quarantine period. They sleep and eat in isolation from the shelter, but are allowed to participate in some activities during the day if the distance rule of 2 meters is feasible. "Puskesmas" the local health care, has visited our clinic with 2 doctors and 4 nurses because of the large group of people who live together. They were very impressed with our measures and facilities that we have at Doldi. If we need medical attention, a doctor will come to the clinic. Puskesmas sees no reason to interfere with our current approach to combat the corona crisis.

Adjustment of precautions

Our staff and children are informed daily with updates about the corona virus worldwide, Indonesia and Sulawesi. This is to raise awareness of the problem and to be able to act adequately if there is reason to do so. If the first person with the virus is tested positive within a radius of 10 km, we go into isolation. This means that 3 of our staff members will do homework and do all the necessary shopping and then deliver it to us at the parking area. By hiring an extra force, mm Ferdi (the wife of Lius) and who has a handicraft program with the children, there are 5 staff members who live and work than completely at the shelter.

Change annual plan

In the newsletter no. 18 of March, on the page health care (medical fund) we have informed you of our plans for medical assistance to underprivileged children in the region. We have to move this plan (for the time being) to 2021 because we are dependent on licensing and putting together a medical team. In health care, all attention is now understandably focused on fighting the corona virus. We expect this to continue for several months as the number of infections continues to rise and we believe that the number of infections is many times greater than confirmed in remote villages.



Budget change

Below you will find the budget for 2020 as presented in newsletter 18. The corona crisis will have an impact on the income and expenses of the budget. (Shaded in yellow) Actions such as income from the sponsor run of the Nijmegen 4-day have been canceled. Donations / gifts will probably be less because companies and / or individuals also have a hard time during this period. The resort's contribution will become "0" because all bookings for this summer have been canceled and it does not look like it will be safe for tourists to book for the time being. For the time being, we do not yet have a financial problem and can also make some cost savings. The item "Shop" children is canceled because it is now integrated into the manager's housing. By moving the medical aid plan action to next year, there has also been a reduction in costs. In the next regular newsletter of October, we can better substantiate the change in the budget with figures.

Note on the 2 meter distance rule

With 30 children, the 2 meter distance rule is difficult to maintain when participating in activities. Because the children have had no contact with the outside world since March 17 and have not finished our terrain, we have relaxed the distance rule with regard to the children. The distance rule between the staff and with the children is strictly enforced. The students have now come out of isolation and quarantine and have joined the children. That is why it was possible to take the group photo, but without our staff.
