Due to these changes, the Foundation's policy must be re-accredited this year, a process that has now been started at the Social Department. For the management team "work to be done" and this ensures that working here is sometimes stressful, but never boring!

Remains, also on behalf of the board to thank you all again for your support!

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Management news





From Dodi.

My working day starts at 06:30 in the morning. While enjoying a cup of coffee I discuss with Opa on his terrace, the events of the previous day and the planning for the day ahead. These conversations usually last until 08:00 and then, in addition to all project interests, world news is also discussed. I have also reached the stage where I can independently carry out my tasks and responsibilities as a manager. Of course, we have our protocols that I have to follow, but these are not covered with all situations that I encounter in practice. My conversations with Opa are therefore a good support for me, so that I can make decisions that are in line with the objectives of the board of the Dolidi Ndano Foundation Netherlands.

Below I give you some information about a special project that I am currently working on.

School problems.

Indonesia has 2 types of schools, government schools called Sekolah Negeri and private schools called Sekolah Swasta. Sekolah Negeri is sponsored by the government and the Sekolah Swasta by a foundation. In 2022, the government has decided that the SD (Primary School), SMP (More Advanced Primary Education), SMA (Secondary School) and SMK (General Vocational Education) schools will be free and that school fees will therefore no longer be charged. The Negeri schools are sponsored by the government and the teachers have a permanent job paid by the government. The Swasta schools must be affiliated with a foundation that takes care of the operation of the school. Both types of schools are present in Tentena and currently all our children still attend the Swasta school in Tentena, sponsored by the GKST foundation (Christian Church Central Sulawesi).

With the new government scheme, private schools were no longer allowed to charge school fees and they also reported this to us, so all schools were free! **However**.... Some private schools are in trouble because they cannot manage their operation because there is no additional support from their foundation. For example, teachers have to make do with less salary or even receive nothing.

Now the Swasta schools have come up with something to get their exploitation done by asking parents for money and no longer call it school fees but "Donation" which will then become mandatory. This is said to have been done with the permission of the Bupati (Regent of the region). If we cooperate with this, nothing will change for our foundation and we do not intend to cooperate. We therefore doubt whether this act is legally valid.

That is why we started to orient ourselves on the Negeri schools in Tentena and have now spoken with the directors of these schools. Our children are simply welcome at these schools and a transfer is no problem. Our provisional conclusion is that we can better place our children at these Negeri schools because of; 1) Tuition is free. 2) School uniforms are free. 3) Quality of education is better because of higher educated teachers.

However, we also believe that our children have a voice and this situation has been discussed with them. Through a survey we asked for their opinion and to tell us if they have a good reason not to change school, for example because they will be entering their last school year in July. The results of the survey have yet to be analysed. To be continued. Dodi.


Budget 2023;

Explanation Charges

Study fund;

Three children will start a new study at the university/academy this year and will move to our student house in Makassar. Three children are also graduating and graduating this year. More details are listed on the study fund page.

Medical fund;

In 2023, the budget for medical care will be lower due to problems with the licensing of our clinic because there are new government guidelines for accreditation. The budgeted amount therefore only applies to the children of the shelter.

Shelter;

There are currently 22 children living in the shelter. The operating costs and fixed costs are budgeted higher for 2023 due to higher expenditure costs due to inflation.

Buildings and Land;

Due to subsidence and earthquakes, more money has been budgeted for maintenance and renovation of some buildings. The construction of a new sports field has been budgeted for the children.

Shelter 1



Construction & Maintenance


Weather influences and natural phenomena in Indonesia sometimes have major consequences for our shelter. Flooding and landslides due to severe weather, earthquakes and strong winds mean that we regularly make construction adjustments and have to carry out maintenance and/or renovation of our land and buildings. In addition to repairing the damage, the ground and/or the building will be provided with adjustments that are fully tailored to the situation for now and in the future. We also provide more safety and comfort. In order to guarantee the quality of building materials as much as possible and to make them affordable, many materials are made by our construction team ourselves, such as building blocks, doors, windows and frames. A foundation of natural stone is placed under each building and reinforcing steel is incorporated into the walls to prevent damage or collapse in the event of an earthquake.


In this edition we show some examples of current activities in the construction and maintenance of land and buildings.



Renovation of sleeping buildings

An earthquake is most likely the cause of the ground subsiding in the bedrooms of the girls' dormitory. Because the floor was now floating on the foundation, and the floor was not designed for this, a dangerous situation arose. The only solution was to cut out the floors and fill the empty spaces with the rubble and cement. All bedrooms are now equipped with a new tile floor. (Photos left)

The lower part of our playhouse was set up as a hangout for our children. However, little use was made of this because the children felt somewhat trapped. Because we needed more storage space for garden tools and machines, we turned this part into a shed and built a new terrace with a roof at the front. Some tables and chairs have been placed and the children often sit there in the evenings, making music and talking. The terrace is decorated with some party lighting for the atmosphere.

Landslite security

The shelter is built against a mountain slope. Due to heavy rainfall combined with a light earthquake, it sometimes happens that we get a landslide on our site. So again now. We repair the damage and reinforce this location with boulders (see photos). Our buildings can withstand these shifts and are therefore not endangered.



Building new boat

Soon our project will also have transport by water again. The reason to build a boat is because the road to Tentena is regularly blocked by landslides and/or the road is under construction. Children then have problems getting to school or getting to school on time. Transport over water is just as fast and therefore the solution. In addition, we can also use the boat for recreational purposes for our children. Opa drew the design for this boat (catamaran type with space for 30 children). The boat is powered by 2 Suzuki 40 HP outboard motors that are privately sponsored by Opa. The floats were built according to traditional construction by an uncle of Gideon. Gideon finishes the project himself with the help of staff and children. For Gideon, who still lives at Dolidi, it is a bit of extra practical experience after his Maritime practical study. He clearly enjoys it. Sawing, planing, sanding, welding and assembling... everything goes well for him. When this project is finished he will look for a job on a cruise ship. Below are some photos of the construction. The boat is ready to sail on April 10!

















New Wi-Fi mast

For years we had WIFI problems due to a bad connection. Often at important moments there was no connection, which is very frustrating. That is why it was decided to have a new high mast with WIFI antenna installed. The connection has therefore become better and more stable!

Her plan is to come to Dolidi when she finds a job. She wants to say goodbye to everyone and share her study experiences with our children.

Tiara has already written a letter of thanks. A passage from the letter;

"Now I have successfully completed my studies and earned a Bachelor of Laws degree. All of this cannot be separated from the helping hands of all parties involved (especially my beloved Opa Eef, The board in the Netherlands, parties from the Netherlands and several other countries who are also donors). You are the one to help me. I am very grateful for the good opportunity given. Sorry if I ever hurt and disappointed the feelings of everyone who loved me. It didn't stop there, but since then, I slowly started to improve myself through the suggestions I received. And also I ask for your blessing so that I can continue with a new beginning to make my dream come true. I will always remember all the great sacrifices I have received from all of you.

For all of my brothers and sisters, you must keep your spirits up because not everyone can get a golden opportunity to go to school and college. Every day is learning. The bad ones are thrown away. Because it is we who control ourselves. For the all of staff, you are amazingly patient with children with different characters. May all be peaceful. Can reduce disputes and always create harmony as befits the relationship between Opa, Management, Staff and Children in one house."









Agnes, has been back in China for her studies since November 2022. After a long period of quarantine and a waiting period for other international students, she was able to continue her studies completely offline again in January 2023. She has now successfully completed another semester of exams.

The new semester has started with a probationary period of 2 months in the university hospital, after which she will fulfill her practical assignment in an offcampus hospital. For this she will (temporarily) move from the campus to an apartment in the vicinity of that hospital. All in all, Agnes is doing very well, but she still misses Dolidi!





Utin, is in the final phase of her studies. She has submitted her exam proposal and it has been accepted and signed. The exam is now scheduled and graduation will be at the end of this vear. After her exam, Utin will come home (Dolidi) for some time until graduation preparations begin.


Rehabilitation Edo

In the previous newsletter (No.23) we reported on Edo's disease. After the treatments in the Siloam hospital Makassar, the rehabilitation was very difficult because Edo did not have the confidence that his heart problem did not endanger his health. At school he was taken to the hospital twice because of alleged heart problems, but they turned out to be unfounded. It was ultimately a psychological problem that prevented him from physically working on his recovery. In the end, after a few conversations, he regained confidence in recovery through physical exertion and is now walking and exercising daily again. He's fine again! Asthma problem solved at Dodi

Since the examination, treatment and medication that Dodi has had in the Siloam hospital in Makassar, the frequency of his asthma attacks has decreased sharply and he currently has no complaints. Dodi dares to travel or go to meetings with peace of mind again without the fear of an attack. To be on the safe side, he now has a "puff" with him to protect himself.



Progress clinic Dolidi Ndano

Our clinic has served as a vaccination and quarantine center during the Covid-19 pandemic. After the pandemic, we wanted to restart the accreditation application for Social Medical Care services for underprivileged children. However, we are now faced with some problems. We no longer experience cooperation from the private hospital "Rumah Sakit Sinar Kasih" in Tentena for the application

and negotiations of the accreditation. To be allowed to operate free medical care for underprivileged children in our clinic, cooperation and guarantees are required (and agreed) with a doctor from this hospital. The clinic could then be accredited and opened under the auspices of this doctor. However, Agreements are not kept and our cooperation is hampered because people do not have time. We also have some complaints about the way of treatment of our children and how we charge for it. We think that this change at the hospital has to do with the new hospital that is currently being built and that people therefore no longer want cooperation. (Photo design)



We have now had a conversation with the director of the Government Hospital "Puskesmas" (also in Tentena) where we are very welcome and where underprivileged children receive free diagnosis and basic treatment. Puskesmas is aware of the existence of our clinic and the possibility to use it. Dodi will consult with the hospital in the coming period to determine whether we can work together and restart the accreditation application for the clinic.

If this is not possible, we will consider using our clinic for another medical purpose, such as dentistry.





Volunteer work



Djura Broijl started her volunteer work on January 2 to support our children. She used the month of December 2022 to acclimatize, sniff some culture and get acquainted with Indonesian customs. Djura graduated in 2022 and obtained her Bachelor of Arts – BA, Ecological Pedagogue I Master of Science – MSc, Youth Studies. Her task as a volunteer is to improve the English language through group lessons and to support the children in their daily activities. In addition, she gives some extra attention and lessons to our 3 children who are busy with their exam (English).

Djura's story about her experiences so far.

My first acquaintance with the children of Dolidi was in Makassar, where I met the current students. Here Utin took me for a tour of the city: what a great first experience with the Dolidi family! Not long after, the journey to Dolidi was continued. Once we arrived, a welcome committee was waiting for us: all the children and staff were waiting for us. A very warm welcome!

After a week of rest, my work as a volunteer started. Although I wouldn't really describe it as 'work' myself, because it's so much fun to do! In the morning I start my day with preparing the lessons and in the afternoon I conduct the lessons.

The freedom I get to create the lessons all by myself and to implement them according to my own interpretation is fantastic! In this way I can express my own creativity, but also meet the needs and levels of the children. In addition to English lessons, I also started teaching about the rights of the child a few weeks ago. Under the guise of 'Know your rights (that's your right!)', we discuss a number of these rights every week and make matching assignments.

As fun as creating the lessons is, the best thing about being a volunteer at Dolidi is the contact with the children. Both during classes and outside. Because I stay on the project with the children, I am also closely involved in their personal development and I get the chance to really build a relationship with them. This is of course very important to me as an educator! Playing volleyball together, watching movies, going on trips or just chatting: I enjoy it a little more every day.
