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Dear sponsors, financial adopters, donors, volunteers and interested parties.

This newsletter is once again full of stories about our children and the way in which we give them another chance at a good future. This time in my foreword I would like to tell you a little more about our success story of the opportunities and results of childcare.

On December 16, 2024, it will be 15 years since the Dolidi Ndano Foundation was founded. We have now given 70 orphans, rejected and underprivileged children a safe home. Sometimes for short-term care, but usually for long-term care.

Short-term care if the child; does not want to live together in good harmony within our large family, does not want to go to school, exhibits bullying behavior, wants more freedom and/or does not want to adhere to our protocols. This child then consciously chooses to return to the family or to childcare. Of course, we do our utmost to prevent these types of situations, which is why we also have an extensive staff who guide and educate the children with the ethical norms and values of life. Sometimes children are admitted with a lack of education. These children see no difference between good and evil and are used to stealing, lying and cheating for their existence. Fortunately, we also achieve good results with our method of raising children and we show these children that things can/must be done differently and that it is better to work in good harmony towards a good future.

After a long period of care, the child reaches a young adult age upon completing senior high school and feels independent of the people around him. The child then decides whether to look for its own identity in society or whether to continue studying at an academy or university. If the child is capable and motivated to study, we will continue to support the child under certain conditions until the study is completed.

Of the 70 children in care, 25% left the shelter prematurely, compulsorily or voluntarily, 50% left the shelter as a young adult and 25% went to study. We are grateful and proud of these results but always strive for better.

Your heart-warming support for our mission has already given many children a future!

It remains for me, also on behalf of the board, to thank you all again for your support!

I hope you enjoy reading it.

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Management news



From Dodi; To properly organize the work in the shelter and the way in which the work should be carried out, Opa has written a 46-page document with 10 protocols containing guidelines for staff and children. These protocols help me manage YWNO because they provide clarity, ensure consistency and the guidelines help resolve bottlenecks. The rights, obligations and codes of conduct for our children are also laid down in these protocols. In the context of a good education for our children, we pay a lot of attention to the rules of conduct for an ethically responsible society. This is especially necessary for the new children in the shelter because they grew up without norms and values. During the Christmas holidays, the children go to their family or community in their native village for a week. We often experience some ethical problems with some children because they have lived without rules for a week and/or have handled their freedoms irresponsibly. Because a child has the right to family contact, we are going to do things a little differently and this year invite the family to come to us for a Christmas celebration with the children. We then organize fun activities during the Christmas holidays for the children within our own "Wongko Ndaya Ongaa" family circle.



From Astin; On the next 2 pages we will again publish our 2023 financial annual report. Filing the annual accounts is a legal obligation for us as a Public Benefit Organization. This makes the foundation's financial information available to anyone who is interested. That is why we also publish this financial statement on our website. Last year was another good year. We have received more than €81,000 in donations that allowed us to fully cover the costs of achieving our goals. Personally, I was admitted to the foundation as an underprivileged child and completed my accountant studies. I have now been working as the financial manager of the foundation for 3 years. I was able to achieve this thanks to your support! I therefore hope that you can/will continue to support us in the future and that we will thus give many more children a chance at a good future. I would like to thank you again on behalf of our children for your support!

Pocket money project; Our children receive pocket money and clothing allowance every month to teach them how to manage money. This way they can practice working with a fixed budget. The pocket money is given in cash and the clothing allowance is deposited into their savings account. They have to use the pocket money to buy items for their personal care and snacks. They can buy this in our store at the shelter where we charge the purchase prices. The savings account is intended to buy (extra) clothing and shoes and to save some extra budget for their future student life. However, we have had some bad experiences with our children's purchasing behavior. Too many snacks are bought, which means they sometimes leave their food because they are no longer hungry. Buying personal care items such as soap and shampoo has become less important to them and they prefer to buy snacks! The children then buy the snacks in the vicinity of the schools so that we have no supervision and we cannot guide them in this. So that's going to change now! We have purchased an automated cash register system for our store that registers the purchasing behavior of our children. The children are then only allowed to shop in our store with their pocket money, so we can better guide them in learning how to handle money. If they do buy snacks outside our store, we register a shortfall in their pocket money expenditure. This way we also have good control over their personal care expenses.

Explanation

Balance sheet 2023; On the balance of the savings account between the medical fund account and the medical fund account, €5,570 was transferred from the medical fund to the study fund on December 31, 2023. The reason is because some clinic activities have been temporarily stopped and more budget is required in 2024 due to the possibility that 4 children will continue their studies after their senior high education.

Budget 2024; In the operating budget, an additional € 2,500 has been budgeted for the school bus and scooters item for the purchase of 2 extra scooters for the possible 4 new students who will study in Makassar. The expenditure budget includes € 1,000 under the investment buildings item for the furnishing of a second student house at GRV. For the Pocket Money project item, an additional € 1,000 has been budgeted for the redesign of our store and the purchase of a cash register system.

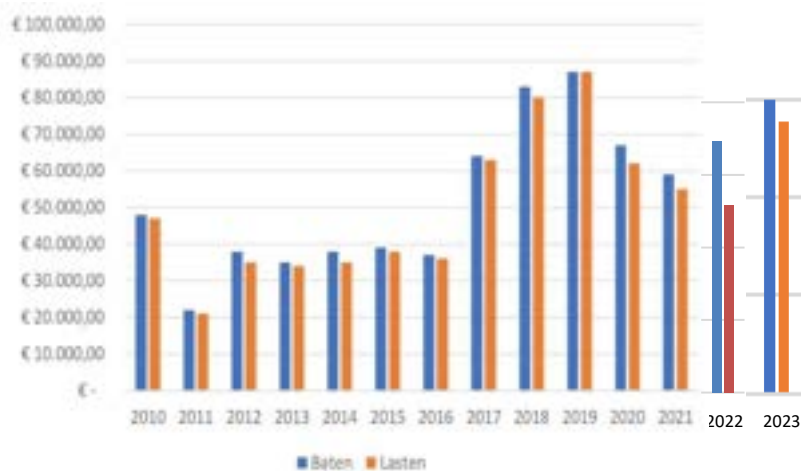

Explanation of charges

- Study fund;** In 2024, the number of students studying in Makassar will increase from 4 to 8. The budget includes an additional cost item for the rent of a second student house at GRV.
- Medical fund;** It does not yet appear that we will provide additional medical care in our clinic in 2024 due to permit problems. The budget is therefore lower than in other years.
- Shelter house;** The operating costs in 2023 were much higher than budgeted due to inflation. The operating costs budget has been adjusted accordingly for 2024.
- Buildings & land;** No major investments are planned with high costs
- Projects;** The store layout for the pocket money project is being expanded.

However, the completion of the house was temporarily stopped in 2023 because the wedding plans were postponed. Enggo has now proposed and they will get married in August! The house will be ready in March!

Green River View

Student news



General; In the city of Makassar there are 19 universities, 45 academies and 46 schools/institutions for almost all possible disciplines. That is why we have rented a house for our students in a monitored and safe environment at the GRV (Green River View) residence. Recently, our staff member Gideon traveled to Makassar and renovated the house and garden furnishings in 2 weeks. Everything looks neat again and the facilities have been improved. The house is now also equipped with air conditioning. The house is currently occupied by 4 of our students. We may rent a second house at this park this year. Four of our children are graduating from Senior High School this year and are eligible to study in Makassar. The rental price of a complete house with 2 bedrooms is approximately € 1,200 per year!



Utin; has already completed her accounting studies in 2023. Her graduation was postponed due to circumstances, but has now been definitively scheduled for Tuesday, April 23, 2024. Utin did not want to sit idle during this period of waiting and started preparing herself better for looking for a job after her graduation. That gave Grandpa the idea to apply for a (temporary) job at Hotel Melia in Makassar, where Opa has very good contacts. The General Manager then offered Utin a 6-month internship program to gain professional work experience in her field of study. Utin has now been with Melia for 3 months and is really enjoying it. Hopefully she will get a chance for a permanent job at Melia because this is a global concern. Utin is open to everything and does not feel region-bound.

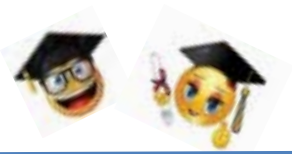
Tabitha, was in the final year of her nursing studies in 2023. She had 9 months to prepare her thesis exam and complete it in October. Unfortunately, during this period she did not focus on her studies and was not well prepared to take the exam. As an excuse, she stated that she could not do her practical assignments because a fellow student with whom she was going to take the practical exam had to get married because she became pregnant and therefore quit her studies. However, Tabitha never reported this problem to us despite the many progress discussions we had or took advantage of the reporting option. The board has terminated our support for her student loans and living expenses. Tabitha has now found work and accommodation and later wants to complete her studies at her own expense.



Tiara, after graduating in law, she spent six months at Dolidi to prepare for her job search. She has now found work in the tobacco industry at PT. HM Sampoerna TBK.in Salatiga on Java. She must complete a (paid) internship in various departments for a year and will then be eligible for an employment contract.



Agnes, is in China taking the thesis exams for her doctoral studies. After almost 6 years of study at the medical university and an internship in all departments of the hospital, her studies to become a doctor in China will come to an end next summer. Her graduation ceremony will be around June. This can't really go wrong because she has achieved the highest score (excellent) for all her thesis exams so far (and there are many). This does not end her studies yet. In order to be allowed to practice in Indonesia, she will have to follow an adjustment procedure that takes 2 to 3 years, after which a diploma with a permit will be issued. 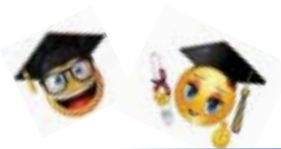
AGNES STUDY PLAN (translated with Google)

My name is Agnes Salarupa, I would like to express my special thanks to Opa Eef as Papa/Grandpa at Wongko Ndaya Ongaa foundation who always tries his best to provide encouragement and financial support to be able to reach the 6th year in the process of completing from my medical training about China. And I also want to say a big thank you to the sponsors, wherever they are, who have been kind enough to give me money, even though I know I spent a lot of money during the first year to this last year, I can't put all repay the kindness of Grandpa and the sponsors who helped me, but I will do my best to be a responsible doctor in the future and help many people who need my help. In this 6th year, I only have 4 months left to complete my medical training in China, so I think it is important for me to discuss several things regarding my plan after completing my training. The plans I have made are the following;

- 1). Since the Indonesian curriculum is slightly different and there is a medical subject that I didn't learn in China, I plan to take private lessons and buy several UKMPPD test books, because the placement test is administered based on the UKMPPD (most likely in Makassar and the duration are still not certain). *Uji Kompetensi Mahasiswa Program Profesi Doctor*
- 2). Based on existing regulations in Indonesia, every student graduating abroad is required to obtain an equivalent degree and go through a two- to three-year adjustment process in certain university hospitals agreed by the government. The steps required are not easy, based on the experiences of our seniors who are currently undergoing adjustment and currently following each registration process.

With the various procedures that exist and have to be carried out in Indonesia, everything seems difficult, but if Opa and the board in the Netherlands still want to support me, I will do my best to make my dream of serving as a board member come true. My goal of practicing as a doctor in Indonesia can then be realized. I also plan to conduct my equivalency in Makassar, considering that there is no quota limit for students entering the campus, they just have to queue at each stage. After the adjustment process of about 2 years is completed and I am declared successful in the doctor competency exam, I will receive a registration certificate (STR) and I am willing to be placed by the government in any hospital and health center and conduct an examination internship program of 2 years (and if the regulations in Indonesia remain unchanged, we will receive a small salary from the internship). And after completing the internship, we take the doctor's oath and are entitled to a registration letter that is valid for life and with which we officially become doctors in Indonesia.





Study fund 3



First year students

The three new students have now successfully completed the first semester of their studies. They quickly got used to life in the big and busy city of Makassar. They feel happy in their new environment and are happy with their stay in our student house at GRV. They live together there in good harmony and have already made many friends at the universities.

Jurni, wants a job as a dietician and/or advisor on nutrition and lifestyle. She is following the nutritionist training (Nutrition & Dietetics) at Hasanuddin University in Makassar. The campus is a 50-minute drive (by scooter) from Green River View.



Olivia, wants a job in healthcare later. She is following basic nursing training at the Stella Maris College of Health Sciences in Makassar. The campus is located at Stella Maris Hospital in the center of Makassar close to Pantai Losari, 10 minutes' drive from GRV.



Cindy, Wants a job in education as a teacher in the future. She is currently studying history at the Faculty of Teacher Training and Education of the University of Pejuang Republic of Indonesia. The campus is a 30-minute drive from GRV.



Four children will take their final exams this year at the Senior High School SMA/SMK in Tentena. After graduation, they have to decide whether they are going to stop schooling and start working, or continue studying. If they decide to stop, they can stay in the shelter for a maximum of 3 months to look for work and shelter. Then they have to leave the house to make room for another underprivileged child who wants to be helped. If they decide to continue their studies, they must meet a number of conditions according to protocol. The conditions are;

- A child must indicate in a timely manner whether he/she wants to study and in which field of study.
- A child must be sufficiently motivated to study.
- A child must be advised and guided by our management team (any family may have no influence on this)
- Immediately after the senior high education exam, the child must complete the application form for student finance and write a motivation.
- The board of the Doldi Ndano Foundation decides whether student financing can/will be allocated.
- All parties must take into account the available budget.
- The board has the right to make adjustments to the application due to costs, but always does this in consultation with the applicant.
- The management team for the entire study process consists of 3 people;
 1. Study advisor (Dodi)
 2. Study supervisor (Opa Eef)
 3. Financial mentor (Astin)

General



Medical care

It has been very quiet in medical care in recent months, the children are healthy and, apart from some flu and aches, have had no further complaints. There have also been no changes or changes to the usability of our clinic. Now that Agnes has made it known that after her studies as a doctor, she wants to help us restart the clinic under her auspices and certification, we are parking the medical care in our clinic until after her studies. Who knows, Olivia as a nurse and Jurni as a nutritionist may want to work with Agnes and form a team in our private clinic to help (underprivileged) children and provide information.

Latest news message

Fendri Maugo, almost 18, reported on February 7 that he wanted to leave the shelter. Our surprise was very great because Fendri had lived with us for 6 years (since June 1, 2018) and was a likeable boy who functioned well within our large family. His results at school were also good and he would graduate from Senior High School next year. When asked why he wanted to leave us, he said he wanted to have more freedom and hang out with his friends. That is against our rules and he found it difficult to follow our rules. His decision was final because his family supported him in this and he could live with his sister in Tentena. We of course made every effort to change his mind, but he was beyond reason. Fendri left us on February 8. We are astonished and do not understand why he chooses an underprivileged life, with complete freedom of course, but he could also have stayed another year and first completed Senior High School.



Sponsorship

The generous donations from our sponsors and adopters have an enormous impact in achieving our goals. Your support motivates us and helps us continue to work hard to achieve our goal. No donations have been received from sponsorship campaigns in the last 5 months, so there is nothing to report about that. However, we received so many donations over the entire year of 2023 that we built up a reserve of more than € 20,000 in liquid assets on our balance sheet on January 1, 2024. That is a good start for the new year 2024, but necessary because of the extra costs we will receive this year for our study fund because four of our children may continue their studies after graduating from Senior High School. And that also entails additional costs due to the additional housing and means of transport in which we have to invest. A healthy foundation has sufficient equity on its balance sheet to be able to invest quickly, which can only be achieved with your loyal financial support!
